While contacting the emergency services it became apparent that it is quite difficult to relay the exact position they need to find. We did manage to relay a postal code to them, and the emergency services arrived within twenty minutes. The good news is that our colleague has made a good recovery and is determined to come back although it will only be for the short walks.

This incident led me to try and find a more effective way to contact the emergency services and to pass on accurate locations. This can be achieved by using a mobile phone APP called "what3words".

With this APP it will immediately bring up a grid and three random words. The services can locate your location from these words. Alternatively, by activating the "get directions" tab on google maps you can get an actual grid position. This could be a real-life saver or just a good way to establish your own position when out walking.

Wish you all safe and enjoyable walking and a happy Christmas season.

COMMUNITY HOUSEHOLD WASTE COLLECTION

You may recall that between December 2018 and March 2019 Erewash Borough Council provided a new community household waste collection service to offer residents the opportunity of disposing of small bulky household waste items at a location that was convenient for them.

The scheme was piloted over a 16-week period at various locations across the borough and proved to be very popular. During the pilot the service was used by just over 900 residents and collected over 42 tonnes of bulky waste and nearly 7 tonnes of waste electrical appliances. The council is now proposing to provide a similar service in 2019/20.

There will be no change in the way the service is provided and residents will be able to dispose of items such as bed frames, old toys, small items of scrap metal, bagged soil, small pieces of furniture and small household electrical items such as hair dryers, toasters and kettles. More details about the service are available on the EBC web site.

A refuse collection vehicle and a caged vehicle will be available at each site for receipt of waste items. The service will be provided between 8.00 am and 11.30 am on the scheduled day and sites will be manned throughout by EBC staff.

The team will be coming to Breadsall on the following dates during this financial year:

Saturday the 30th of November 2019

Saturday the 15th of February 2020

A breath of fresh air in Derby

This year the Sustrans Derby Rangers have been organising monthly led rides in and around Derby with the goal of getting more people to cycle. As volunteers we wanted the rides to be a fun and sociable events for people who already knew how to cycle but needed some encouragement.

At the beginning of March we only had two attendees but after that things improved and we regularly had around 15 riders. Similarly, we've grown from two volunteers with ride management training to four – which means we can split a larger group in two.

When we were out and about we followed a mixture of routes along traffic-free sections of the National Cycle Network and quiet roads. We used Route 6 to Elvaston Castle and to Swarkestone, as well as Mickleover Greenway and Breadsall Greenway which are both sections of the same disused railway line.

We sent out a survey to all participants and they told us that they really valued the social aspect of the rides as well as giving them the chance to get some exercise! Almost everyone said that the rides had encouraged them to do more cycling this year which is great news!

I think everyone enjoyed running the rides, even if it was hard work at times. We are taking a break over the winter but we have started planning our calendar for next year. A38 JUNCTION SCHEME UPDATE.

There have been various recent developments with the proposed upgrade of the A38/A61 junction near to Breadsall. This is a matter of concern to many residents of Breadsall and a brief summary of the present position is given below. More information can be found online.

In 2002 the Highways Agency published proposals for upgrades to the three roundabouts on the A38 near Derby at Kingsway, Markeaton and Little Eaton, creating flyovers for through traffic to reduce congestion. The initial proposals for the Little Eaton junction involved two options for routing the A38 to the north-west of the present junction, further away from Breadsall. In a consultation in 2003, however, the Highways Agency introduced a third option routing the A38 to the south-east of the present junction, bringing it significantly closer to Breadsall. Many residents of Breadsall sent objections to the new option three and the Parish Council organised a petition which gathered over 300 signatures.


The scheme was then put on hold for a long period because of budget restrictions but in 2015 Highways England, successor to the Highways Agency, announced that it was now promoting option three for the Little Eaton Junction, having all but ignored the 2003 petition. (Remarkably the entire petition was counted as a **single vote** against option three). This announcement caused considerable anxiety in Breadsall and the Parish Council established an action group to represent it in opposing the Highways England scheme. The action group held extensive dialogue with Highways England, putting forward several alternative proposals, but Highways England rejected all of them. Highways England has, however, introduced some measures to help mitigate the adverse visual and physical effects of the scheme on Breadsall village. These include tree belts, noise barriers, use of low-noise road services and the omission of overhead lighting on elevated sections of road.

Highways England is now seeking formal approval for the alterations to the three junctions. Because this is classed as a “Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project” Highways England has to seek a “Development Consent Order” which is examined by the Planning Inspectorate and then determined by the Secretary of State. This replaces the normal mechanism for obtaining planning permission. Highways England submitted its draft Development Consent Order in April and the process of formal examination by the Planning Inspectorate is now underway.

As part of this process the Parish Council has registered as an “interested party” and recently submitted written representations to the Planning Inspectorate. This submission has two elements. Firstly, the Parish Council has drawn attention to serious flaws in the process by which option three was selected and asked the Planning Inspectorate to require a complete re-examination of the design of the Little Eaton junction. Secondly the Parish Council has sought to secure the maximum level of mitigating measures in the event that the current scheme proceeds and has also objected to a proposed footpath closure near the new junction.



The Memorial Hall held its AGM in September with clubs giving their annual reports. A great deal of maintenance has taken place inside and outside the Hall over the last year, half of it carried out by professionals and half by volunteers. This raised £415 towards Hall funds, the main income coming from the raffle and the bar, and was our 34th Live & Local event. Our fund raising continues with the popular Snowdrops Weekend which will be held on Saturday and Sunday the 14/15th February




Bowls Club Report

In April this year we became part of HCT Group, a large scale Social Enterprise and the biggest provider of Community Transport services in the country.

Since October 2017 we have been operating the Derbyshire Connect (Shopping Bus) service on behalf of Derbyshire County Council in the Amber Valley, Chesterfield, North East Derbyshire, Bolsover and Erewash areas.

Derbyshire Connect is a bookable door to door shopping bus service for people who are unable to use conventional buses because of mobility difficulties or because they live in areas with limited bus services.

The Derbyshire Connect service provides a once a week service to a local town centre or supermarket. The day and time of the trip is advised upon registration and booking.

The REALLY good news is this service is completely FREE OF CHARGE for Gold Card (Bus Pass) holders.

Please keep an eye on the drains, gullies and culverts as you go around the village, whether it be wet or dry if you see any blockages please let either the Clerk or DCC know in order that the team can be called to clear the problem.
