There are one or two dates coming up in the calendar which I hope will be of interest to many residents in the Parish.

The first date to make you aware of is 27<sup>th</sup> June when the Parish Council has organised another CPR training

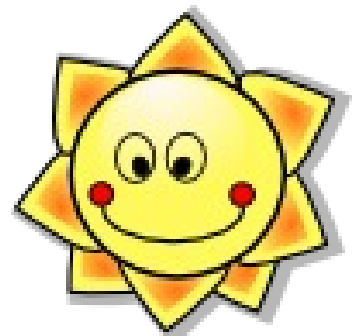
session for some of the older school children. This will be followed, as previously, by a free session for anyone to attend. We now have a fully functioning defibrillator outside the Memorial Hall and think that to know how to use this and also how to give emergency treatment is important so please come along and take advantage of these free classes. The classes are run by the First Responders who do not make a charge, but we do give a donation to help with their travel and running costs. We are most grateful for their support and were pleased that the school children came along last year and gained some valuable instruction and were very enthusiastic.

The second date is 13<sup>th</sup> July when the Carnival Committee will be holding their first Carnival on the Playing Fields and Memorial Hall. The last Carnival was held in 1995. If any of you have read the recently published book by Roy Ling you will have seen pictures from previous Carnivals. They were very happy occasions and certainly brought the village together which is what the new committee is hoping to do. We are most fortunate to live in a village community and the best way to enjoy it is by being involved. There is a lot of hard work put into organising a Carnival so I hope you come along and help to make this year a success.

There are two main things to making the Carnival a success, a fine day and lots of people!

Sadly, there has been more vandalism on the Greenway. When the Greenway was constructed brick walls were built to indicate where the old station buildings had been. Over the past weeks these walls have been partially destroyed, more than once. Mindless vandalism is very difficult to understand as it achieves nothing and costs us all money to put right. The Greenway is very well used so if you see anything which could help to identify the miscreants could you please contact the Parish clerk and it will be reported to our local police officer who is already aware of the situation. We do not know if the same youngsters are the ones who are also coming onto the children's play area and, although at this point, they have not caused any damage, they are leaving behind lots of litter and cans which could indicate underage drinking. The police were most helpful last year when a similar situation arose, and it was fairly quickly nipped in the bud.

The Parish Council has made an effort to tidy up the old lay-by on Croft Lane by painting the fence to get rid of the graffiti. We are hoping to do more work there and are still keen to enter the Erewash in Bloom competition at some point so let us know if you are interested in helping.

## CAMPAIGN TO RECRUIT SHARED LIVES CARERS IN DERBYSHIRE

Could you open up your home to give older people or adults with disabilities the chance to lead ordinary lives in the community?

Derbyshire County Council is looking for more people to become Shared Lives carers.

Although we need carers all over Derbyshire, we are particularly looking for people in the High Peak and Derbyshire Dales.

The scheme offers over 18s the chance to move in with a carer to share their family life for a long term arrangement, short break or day care.

There is no upper age limit on becoming a Shared Lives carer although they have to be over 18.

They can come from all backgrounds, can be working, unemployed or retired. They can become a carer regardless of gender, race, religion, sexual orientation or disability.

They don't need to own their home but they need to be patient with a stable home life, flexible and willing to learn.

Full training is provided and support is on hand. Carers are paid depending on the type of support they offer.

Shared Lives is registered with the Care Quality Commission and carers are assessed and approved.

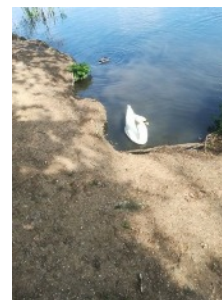

# Church News

## CHURCH NEWS SUMMER 2019



THE GOOD NEWS is we have welcomed our new Parish Priest to Breadsall, the Revd. Kate Plant. She, with her husband Tom and Jean (Tom's Mum) are now residing in a refurbished Rectory, and as Kate said 'loving it '.

Bishop Jan led a joyful Licensing Service for Kate which took place in St. John the Baptist Church at Smalley. Kate has three parishes to care for, Breadsall and Morley with Smalley, some of our services will be shared with our sister Churches. We followed the Licensing with a joint Eucharist at Morley Church on Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> May, followed by the Ascension Day service at All Saints Breadsall on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> May.

**IN PREPARATION FOR EASTER** the Lent groups, held for six weeks on a Thursday and Friday evenings were well attended by all three Churches. On Good Friday morning children enjoyed an Easter Fun time in Church. From 1.00pm to 2.30pm there was a Prayer Walk around Breadsall Village followed by a short service from 2.30pm to 3.00pm. We had a joyful celebration for Easter Sunday, 10.15am, at which Sister Diana presided and at the last 'Hallelujah' all children (and some adults) raced into the Churchyard to see who could find the most Easter eggs!!!

THANK YOU to everyone who gave so generously to the Easter flowers, the Church was open on Sunday afternoon and Monday for people to visit if they so wished.

### Services

Our pattern of services has only changed slightly.

Kate is presiding at All Saints for; Eucharist at 8.00am every Sunday.

Morning prayer at 8.00am during the week.

A Eucharist service on the second and fourth Sunday in the month at 10.15am.

This means the Baptism service, when there is one, will be on the second Sunday. The exception being June and July, Baptisms that had been arranged before Kate was appointed.

The first Sunday continues to be our All Age Worship.

The third Sunday Morning Prayer.
