Breadsall Parish Council Newsletter

WELCOME from the Chair - Councillor Chris Goodwin



The Parish Council has resumed its meetings in the Memorial Hall and we are always pleased to see any member of the public who wishes to come along, either simply as an observer or to raise any matter of concern. The Clerk can always be contacted if the matter needs to go onto the agenda or there is a short period of time at the beginning of each meeting where the public are allowed to speak.

In November a wreath was laid on Remembrance Sunday by the Parish Council. I always think we do this on behalf of the whole Parish as we are at the service to represent the Parish. Due to the COVID restrictions which were still in place at that time, there was not the usual parade of the uniformed organisations but it was good to see they were represented for the wreath laying at the Memorial. I would like to thank the councillors who put up the poppies in the village and also the children who made their own poppies and a wreath.

The Christmas brass band concert was held in the church this year as the numbers were restricted at the Memorial Hall. We worked along with the Friends of the Church and the proceeds from the concert were shared, the Parish Council share going towards the cost of the lights on the tree and the Friends share going to the Padley Centre.

The Neighbourhood Plan is once more with Erewash Borough Council and there is more about this further in the Newsletter. I must say this has all been far too long winded and most frustrating for the steering group who have worked so hard to try to write a plan which is relevant to the Parish and deals with the concerns of the residents. Let's hope that we can get this passed and bring it to a referendum.

The new web site is up and running so please get in touch with the Clerk if you would like to advertise any activities or information about a club or organisation you are involved with. Thanks are due to the Clerk who has spent quite some time trying to make a website which is attractive and easy to access.

We are still unfortunately having play equipment vandalised. The Parish Council is looking for funding to try to improve the play area and hope that this will be a worthwhile project and that new equipment will not be treated in this mindless way. New CCTV cameras have been purchased which will give clearer pictures to try to deter such behaviour.

The Parish Council is hoping to purchase some mugs to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and present them to the school children who reside in the Parish. Details of when and where have yet to be confirmed but we felt we should mark this important occasion as the Parish Council has done in previous years.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE



Readers will recall that the Parish Council resolved in 2016 to promote a Neighbourhood Plan and appointed an advisory group to

produce it. The purpose of a Neighbourhood Plan is to create planning policies which are tailored to the requirements of a specific area (in this case Breadsall Parish) and which must then be taken into account when planning applications are determined.

After a series of consultation exercises the Parish Council submitted a final draft of the Neighbourhood Plan to Erewash Borough Council in June 2019 and a copy of this is available on the Parish Council website. Having checked that the draft plan met legal requirements the Borough Council was required to arrange a six-week consultation period and then appoint an independent examiner to scrutinise the plan. The examiner's report was finally issued in late November 2020.

The examiner recommended the modification or removal of most of the policies in the draft plan for various reasons, principally that the Neighbourhood Plan could not duplicate or conflict with existing national or local planning policies and must generally promote rather than restrict development. The result was a reduction in the extent of the policies in the draft plan and the rephrasing of some surviving policies to make the wording less precise. In particular much of the text related to housing policies was deleted leaving, for example, no reference at all to control of the density of development. At the same time some policies did survive with relatively little modification including designation of local green space, protection of key vistas, identification of buildings of local heritage interest and preservation of local facilities.

The final stage in the process of adopting the Neighbourhood Plan is a referendum and it is the responsibility of the Borough Council to determine the precise content of the final version to be presented in the referendum. The Parish Council put forward detailed objections to some of the examiner's recommendations, pointing out in particular that the examiner had rejected some provisions while allowing almost identical wording in the approved plan for Little Eaton. At a meeting with the advisory group in July 2021 the Borough Council's position was that it would rigidly adopt all the examiner's recommendations, but the Parish Council continued to request a limited number of changes, focusing mainly on the anomalies with the Little Eaton plan. In his most recent reply the Borough Council's Head of Planning and Regeneration states that the Parish Council's proposals "deserve detailed scrutiny" but that he will be unable to carry out this scrutiny before April.

The Parish Council is frustrated that the whole process has taken so long, mainly because of limited resources at the Borough Council, and that the permitted content of the plan is in practice so restricted that it can scarcely fulfil its official purpose to "give communities the power to develop a shared vision for their area" When the Borough Council's forthcoming reply is received the Parish Council will have to decide whether there is sufficient merit in the final version to proceed to referendum or whether to withdraw the plan.



DOG FOULING IN THE PARISH SADLY SEEMS TO BE ON THE INCREASE AGAIN.

All dog owners are expected to clear up after their dog, to help maintain the cleanliness of the district for everyone.

Dog fouling is not only deeply unpleasant, it is dangerous. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocarasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizures.

Dog fouling is an offence. You may be liable to a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £100 if you fail to clear up after your dog. The law states that being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse.

You can use any plastic bag to pick up your dog's waste. It must be put in a public dog waste bin or a public litter bin for general waste.

You should always take plastic bags or 'poop-scoops' with you **every time** you walk your dog.



Please help to keep our lovely village free of this unpleasant and unwanted waste!

On a related note, there is no legislation regarding horse droppings on the road, partly because unlike dog poo there is no danger to human health from droppings from a healthy horse. However, horse riders should use the highway and not ride on footpaths – and drivers should be aware of the new rules in the 2022 Highway Code that give more protection to walkers, horse riders and cyclists.

To report dog fouling in your area

- If it seems too good to be true, it probably is
- If you're being asked to transfer money quickly or in an unusual way such as iTunes vouchers or money transfer services like MoneyGram or Western Union or by someone you don't know
- If you have been asked for personal information like passwords, card details or PINs from an organisation who wouldn't normally ask for these details eg. the NHS
- If you receive an unusual email or text message to suggesting 'you missed a delivery' particularly when you aren't expecting anything

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

ASB is a term that you hear a lot, but do you know what classes as anti-social behaviour? The law defines anti-social behaviour as behaviour that 'causes, or is likely to cause, harassment, alarm or distress to any person'. However, this does not mean that anything constitutes ASB; there are a number of other considerations that professionals use.

Derbyshire County Council and Derbyshire Constabulary developed and launched an ASB Hub where you can find information on what is and what isn't ASB, how you can report it, what action can be taken and much more. To have a look at the hub go to: view.pagetiger.com/asb/derbyshire

Whether you are a child, a parent / carer or an older adult, if you use a device to go online you could be a target for fraudsters. Luckily, there is a wealth of very useful information available for you to reduce the risk of you being a target.

- Protect your device - ensure the latest updates are installed as this helps to prevent it being vulnerable
- Don't use the same password for every site, ensure passwords are not easy to guess and include a combination of letters, numbers and special characters
- Make sure you use an anti-virus software and spyware software - you can get free versions or pay for a subscription and the level of protection will vary. However they will help you to avoid being a victim of identity theft, fraudulent websites and much more
